


STRONG SUPPLY CHAIN

EXCELLENT RIVERSIDE SITES

A number of guayside and riverside locations are available, some with infrastructure already in place, enabling companies to set up operations quickly, conveniently and cost-effectively.

SWANS OFFSHORE ENERGY PARK

Located in Wallsend, Swans offers 12.94 hectares of development land with Enterprise Zone status for the offshore energy, subsea and marine industries. The riverside site provides a fully operational 300m deep water quay with draught of up to 9.1m and heavy load out facilities at up to 10 tonne per m2.

SWANS CENTRE FOR INNOVATION (CFI)

The Swans CFI provides state-of-the-art serviced office accommodation on the banks of the River Tyne. The CFI offers a range of fully refurbished offices to suit all businesses, from start-ups to established companies, in the renewable and offshore energy sectors. With over 1,500 sq m of space and benefits including superfast broadband, staffed reception, meeting and conferencing facilities, the Swans Centre for Innovation provides an exciting opportunity for office-based businesses to be part of this dynamic community.

ROYAL OUAYS ENTERPRISE PARK

Located in North Shields, Royal Quays Enterprise Park is a large development area of up to 20 hectares, connected to the multiple River berths at Whitehill Point and the International Ferry & Cruise Terminal capable of accommodating vessels up to 300m in length. The site has Enterprise Zone status offering enhanced capital allowances and a simplified planning regime.

EOUINOR/SSE RENEWABLES O&M BASE

The two companies behind the world's biggest offshore wind farm, Dogger Bank, will build a new Operations and Maintenance (O&M) Base at the Port of Tyne's Tyne Dock Enterprise Park.

The new multi-million pound facility, which includes both office space and a warehouse, will be the onshore base for Equinor's teams ensuring the efficient operation of the wind farm. The flagship project is expected to generate over 200 direct jobs in the region, as well as opportunities for companies at all levels of the supply chain. The Dogger Bank Wind Farm is estimated to trigger a total capital investment of approximately GBP 9 billion between 2020 and 2026.

RELEVANT **EXPERIENCE AND SKILLS**


The region's heritage of excellence in heavy and marine engineering, shipbuilding and offshore oil and gas extraction has resulted in a highly skilled, available workforce with 28,045 employees working in the North East energy sector. Its capacity in production engineering is particularly relevant to high-volume offshore development.

WORLD-LEADING **RESEARCH AND** INNOVATION

The region has a fantastic array of worldclass R&D and testing facilities such as the National Offshore Renewable Energy Catapult Testing facility and Tyne Pressure Testing.

TRAINING EXCELLENCE

There are a number of colleges in the area delivering bespoke training for tomorrow's energy workforce including South Shields Marine School, an OPITO approved training centre with a worldwide reputation for outstanding maritime training. The Energy Academy in North Tyneside delivers qualifications from Level 2 through to degree level in energy technologies, manufacturing and maintenance. AIS and Maersk Training also offer specialist courses for the offshore oil & gas, wind energy and industrial sectors from their state-ofthe-art industrial training facilities in the region.

WELL-CONNECTED INFRASTRUCTURE

The region is served by Newcastle International Airport, with over 80 direct destinations, including daily flights to Aberdeen, London, Dubai, Amsterdam and Paris. Newcastle City Heliport is also ideally located within walking distance of Newcastle Central Station to service offshore wind projects, including Dogger Bank. The national rail network is within easy reach, many direct trains from Newcastle allow executive and workforce movement throughout the UK, with London being less than 3 hours away by train. The Port of Tyne offers direct sea connections to 5 continents across the world.

High quality public transport includes an extensive bus service and the Tyne and Wear Metro, the second largest light rail system in the UK after the London Underground. Covering 60 stations across the region, the Metro directly links major employments sites along the River Tyne with residential and retail areas, as well as the airport and Newcastle Central Station.

LOWER **OPERATING** COSTS

The typical cost saving for employing an engineering in the North East is over 25% compared to Greater London, over 7.5% cheaper than Aberdeen and over 48% compared to other major European cities. Office costs are over 30% lower than in Scotland, half as costly as those in Paris and over twothirds cheaper than Greater London. Industrial costs are also over 29% cheaper than Edinburgh and Aberdeen and almost three-quarters lower than South East England and Greater London.





ACCESS TO FUNDING SUPPORT

Businesses locating to North Tyneside may be eligible for a North of Tyne Inward Investment Grant of up to £1m depending on the requirements of the project.

North Tyneside is also home to two Enterprise Zone sites for high quality industrial development, all with easy access to deep water ports. Enterprise Zone benefits include enhanced capital allowances for investment in new plant and machinery.
